

Vehicle Recovery - UK - September 2013

This report presents a review of the UK vehicle recovery market. It is an update to Mintel's previous review on this sector published in September 2012. A year on from the last report there is strong evidence that prospects for the vehicle recovery sector are improving. Aside from the strong performance of the UK economy during 2013, the fact that new car sales in particular are strengthening is especially encouraging. Taken with rising revenues for the big three players in this market (AA, RAC and Green Flag), Mintel is now more confident that the market will begin to see growth after a difficult period following the UK entering recession in 2008.

Competition is strong within the sector with the last few years seeing intensification as a number of drivers have either opted to not hold insurance or downgrade. Nevertheless our research suggests that consumers are still looking at varying levels of cover of which the most basic, roadside assistance is not the most popular.

Currently the big three seem to be making strides to strengthen their presence after a period when smaller players were beginning to make progress in taking share. Investment in new technology, in particular, is a focus for all three.
