With China's economy continuing to stagnate, the spending confidence and behaviours of consumers is an element that is of vital importance to players and brands in the China market. In last year's report, Mintel identified that consumers are optimistic in a cautious way. After a turbulent year in 2016, Mintel's study has discovered a strong re-bound in consumer confidence, reaching its highest level since 2013, with Millennials and lower tier city residents being the main drivers of the re-bound.
