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"Amsterdam remains the epicentre of hotel development in the Low Countries, with some 50 hotels in the pipeline, though a brake has been put on future projects due to a recent ban on new hotel development. Luxembourg looks set for a significant expansion of its hotel capacity in the coming years, spurred on, in part, by relocating financialsector executives from London due to Brexit."
